## National German Soccer Team - Notes

- has represented Germany in international competition since 1908
- From 1950 to 1990, it was essentially the team of [west Germany](#)
- is one of the three most successful national teams in international competitions
- have won a total of three [World Cups](#) and three [European Championships](#)
- They have also been runners-up three times in the European Championships, four times in the World Cup, and have won a further four third places
- Current head coach [Joachim Löw](#), assistant coach [Hans-Dieter Flick](#)
- Germany has won the [World Cup](#) three times, behind only [Brazil](#) (five titles) and [Italy](#) (four titles)
- has finished as runners-up four times.
- Germany scored the most with a total of 16 goals in the 2010 World Cup
- 12[René Adler](#), 1[Manuel Neuer](#), 22[Ron-Robert Zieler](#) are the goalies
- Low has proved that he is not afraid to make ruthless decisions
- goalkeeper coach [Andreas Köpke](#)
- athletic coach Shad Forsythe, athletic coach Oliver Bartlett

- After world war 2 they became three new German states, [West Germany](#), [East Germany](#) and [Saarland](#)

- has been coaching the national german soccer team since July 12, 2006.
