Set Up Your Revision Space

- 1. Choose an argument or rhetorical analysis essay you've written in this class.
- 2. Create a new Google Doc called "Essay Transitions Remodel"
- 3. Paste your essay into this new doc.

Evaluate Your Writing

1. Re-read your essay. After each body paragraph, ask:

Are there sentences that could go in any order within this paragraph?

(highlight them)

2. After the last body paragraph, ask yourself:

Could these body paragraphs be sequenced in another way and it

wouldn't matter? (leave yourself a comment)

Revise Your Writing

- Add transition words, phrases, or clauses to the areas you highlighted or commented on during your evaluation. Re-read to ensure the ideas now flow better.
- 2. Do a final proofread through your essay to check for sentences that have errors in parallel structure. Make revisions as needed.

Share Your Process

- 1. Take your computer and sit with your small writing group.
- Each person should share out one area where they revised, and name the type of revision they made (transitional word, phrase, clause, or fixed parallelism).
- 3. Afterwards, discuss what was challenging about this revision. What were some common struggles in the group?
