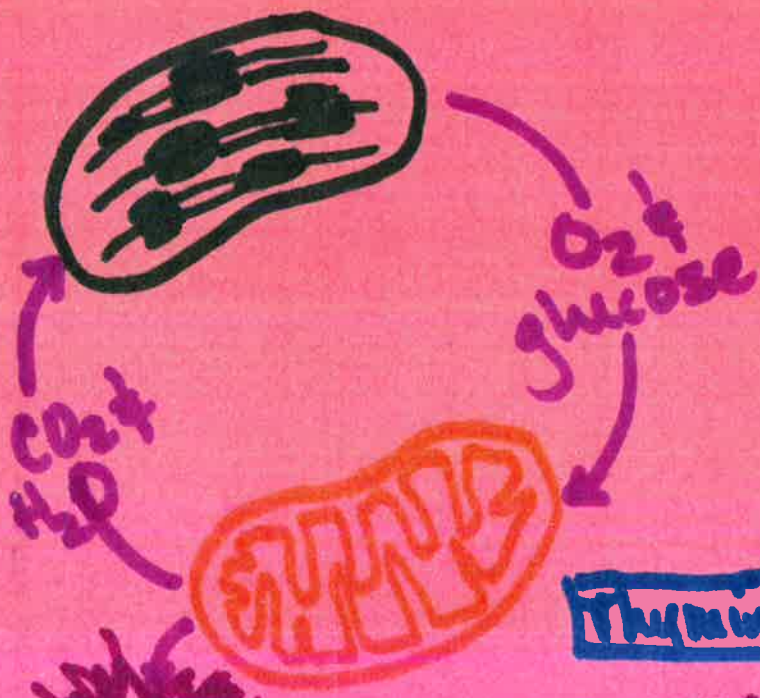


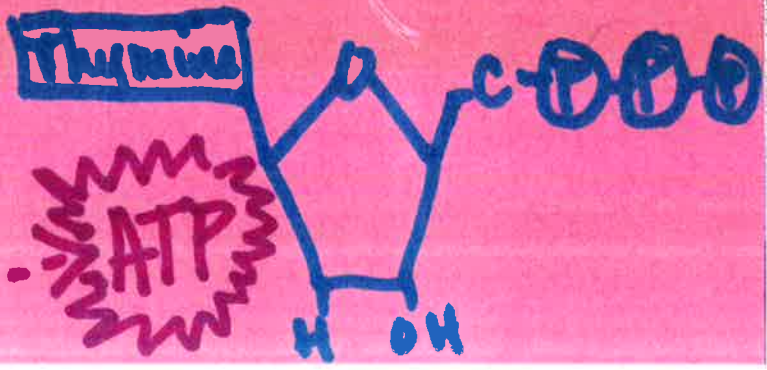

Points Earned	Meaning	Descriptors
10	A W.O.W. product (W.O.W.= Work of Wonder)	-all of the requirements are evident and EXCEEDED -the product is VERY neatly completed & EXTREMELY well-organized -the product shows LOTS of creativity and is colorfully illustrated -completed on time
8	What is expected	-all of the requirements are evident -the product is neatly completed and well-organized -the product shows creativity and is colorfully illustrated -completed on time
7	Almost what is expected	-most requirements are evident, but a few missing -the product is neatly completed and organized -the product shows some creativity and is illustrated -completed on time
5	Sort of what is expected	-some requirements are evident, but many are missing -the product is completed and sort of organized -the product shows little creativity and is illustrated -completed on time
3	Not what is expected	-MANY of the requirements are NOT PRESENT -the product is VERY POORLY completed and POORLY organized -the product show LITTLE TO NO creativity and illustrations are POORLY completed -completed on time
0	Does not meet standards	-unscorable or no product

The LEFT side... "the output"	The RIGHT side... "the input"
<ul style="list-style-type: none">-The left pages in your INB demonstrate your understanding of the information from the right side of the INB.-The left pages allow you to interact with the information in creative, unique and individual ways.-The left pages reflect how you learn science as well as what you learn in science	<ul style="list-style-type: none">-The right side is for writing down information you are given in class-The right side includes the use of Cornell style notes with student generated study questions and summaries-Use highlighting & color to make important information stand out

Why have a left & right side to your INB??

This notebook style *uses both the right and left hemispheres of the brain* to help you sort, categorize, remember, and creatively interact with the new knowledge you are gaining. The more you process information, the more you begin to understand and make connections with previous knowledge, which will *lead to deeper understanding of the information and longer retention of the information.*
