

Dear AP Stat Students (of Sheldon High School),

Boy how things have changed. I just received information this morning that AP has just announced that they will be making modifications to the exam format this year due to the Corona virus. For schools affected by the virus (I think that would mean us, too):

- A modified shorter exam will be given
- The ability to take that exam at home, on-line, will be offered (face to face exams will not be offered as an option, I think?)
- You will have options of two different dates to take your exam, one early or one later. Those dates have not been announced.
- The exam will cover Units 1-7, but not 8-9. For you that means that material associated with our textbook in Chapters 11 and 12 will not be on the exam. In other words, you will not see Inference questions on Chi-Square or Slope.

At this point we cannot count on having the face-to-face review sessions that we planned. Instead, you will have to proceed on your own. I will try to support you as best that I can. With that in mind:

- a) Starting on Wednesday, March 25th, AP will be posting free live review sessions done by experienced AP instructors. I would suggest you check them out.
- b) This morning I just opened up all PPC – MCQ's for Units 1 to 7 (remember that you have already done the ones for Units 1 to 5 but you may want to consider doing them anyway).
- c) I will be posting some practice Free Response Questions with solutions (I'll call it the "Big 6").
- d) Remember that you have the Strive For 5 book that you can use, including the two full length practice exams with answers.
- e) For those of you who think that you might want more structure, consider looking into the Stat Medic Review Sessions (costs around \$29.99). I am almost positive they will be adjusting their review course with the current changes in mind.

I will contact you as I receive any other information in regards to AP Statistics. Feel to reach out if you have questions. Stay safe. (don't go on any cheap cruises just because they are cheap..... Elizabeth!). Keep washing your hands everyone. Stay compassionate about those that are around you.
