Entries will be displayed during the Annual Asian Celebration on February 18 and 19. All entries will also be considered for publication in the summer issue of *Skipping Stones*. All Students published in the magazine will receive a comp. copy of the issue.

Haiku is a traditional poetry form that comes from Japan. It consists of three lines. The first line and third line both have five syllables and the middle line has seven (But we will not be very strict). Haiku appeals to the senses (sight, sound, smell, taste, touch) and touch the heart. Nature art can accompany your haiku, and is encouraged!

On the back of your entries, provide this information:
