

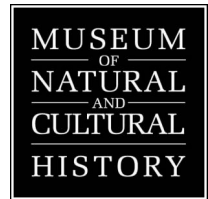

All programs are inquiry-based and rooted in National and Oregon State Standards. All programs are appropriate for grades 1-5.

☐ **Animals of Ancient Oregon:** Explore the skulls and teeth of a Saber-Tooth Cat, Mammoth, Dire Wolf and more from ancient Oregon. Students will discover the importance of teeth in predicting the types of food these animals ate by visiting activity stations. Students will see, touch, and physically experience what teeth do for animals.

☐ **Fun with Fossils:** Fossils are old, but how old really? What can fossils tell us about Oregon's past? Students will see, touch, and make predictions about real fossils.

☐ **Artifacts as Primary Sources:** What information do artifacts tell us about how people lived in Oregon thousands of years ago? Allow us to bring artifacts to your classroom for students to see and touch. This popular activity provides students with the opportunity to learn about people from Oregon's past.

☐ **Geographic Regions of Oregon:** Learn about the diverse regions of Oregon with hands-on, inquiry-based discussion and exploration that will focus on the environment and culture of each of the four Oregon Regions. Recommended for 4th and 5th graders.
