

• The differential in Math passing rate between 4J and the state grows across grades. In other words: the longer students have stayed in 4J the more they outperform the average student in the state



- In Math the total passing rate went slightly down, with elementary schools lowering their
  passing rate, middle schools staying about at the same level, and high schools increasing
  significantly their passing rate
- In Reading the total passing rate went slightly down, with elementary and middle schools lowering their passing rate and high schools increasing theirs
- In Science the total passing rate went slightly up, with elementary and middle schools increasing their passing rate and high schools lowering theirs
- In high school Writing the passing rate reminded at 69

• Growth scores were higher in 4J that in the state both in Math and Reading, indicating that 4J students in 2013-14 tended to grow in their learning more than the average Oregon student

- Tested 4J elementary students grew in their learning only slightly less than the state average, but 4J middle school students grew more than the state average, and 4J high school students grew in their learning at a significantly faster pace than the state average both in Reading and Math
- At the high school level 4J outperformed both Bethel and Springfield in all subjects in 2014
  - In Math, Reading, and Writing 4J high schools improved their passing rates more from 2013 to 2014 that the high schools in Bethel and Springfield

- Performance by school in Math:
  - Given how growth is computed it is very difficult for a school to concatenate two years in a row of high growth, since after a year of high growth the school starts being compared to higher performing schools
