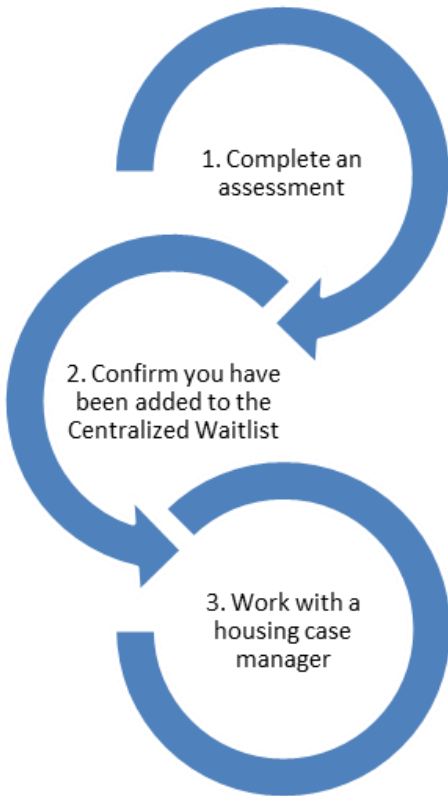


LANE COUNTY'S COORDINATED ENTRY

What is Coordinated Entry? Coordinated Entry is the process to help people who are experiencing homelessness and fill vacancies in a limited number of housing slots in the community. Through Coordinated Entry, the most vulnerable people in the community no longer must advocate for themselves at multiple agencies to access housing programs.

There are three main steps to Coordinated Entry:



Step 1: Complete an assessment with a Front Door Assessor

One of the front door assessors listed at the bottom of this page will determine if you pre-qualify and then complete the assessment with you. Once it is completed, the front door assessor will request that you be added to a Centralized Waitlist that is designated housing for households and individuals who are homeless. **Note: Your assessment is only valid for 6 months.** After 6 months you must complete another assessment.

Step 2: Confirm you have been added to the Centralized Waitlist

The next step is to confirm you have been added to the Centralized Waitlist by contacting one of the front door assessors. The Centralized Waitlist is prioritized by vulnerability, meaning it **is not a first come first serve waitlist and the list is always changing.** It is also important that you keep any contact information current.

Step 3: Work with a housing case manager

Once a housing provider has space available, they will request a referral from the Centralized Waitlist. The housing provider will then contact you to schedule an intake meeting. You and the housing provider will work closely together to find appropriate housing.



Important Note: The Centralized Waitlist has very limited slots and it is not the only housing option in Lane County. For example, **the waitlist does not include Section 8, public housing, or low-income housing.** It is highly encouraged that you continue to keep searching for other housing options while you are on the Centralized Waitlist.
