
<u>Vocational Rehabilitation</u> We work closely with OVRS to help connect students who are interested with paid employment.


Academic Preparation

- Connections Staff can support students with their LCC credit coursework.




Important LCC Information




Lane Community College Support

- Students will attend 2 half-day Sessions in September. Case managers will schedule individual appointments to set goals, create a schedule and a transition plan with students and their support team.
- The purpose is to build a team atmosphere, establish expectations/set goals, and to identify student strengths
- New and returning students are expected to attend orientations.



BUS PASSES

 Orientation
- You will receive a Bus pass when you sign up for Fall
 Term Seminars (Day 3 of Orientation).
- Do no lose this pass as they are limited and there will be a replacement fee.
