

Farther vs. Further

Rule:

"Farther" refers to physical distance.

"Further" refers to figurative distance, like an amount of time, quantity, or degree.

Examples:

Farther: The farther Molly walked down the mountain path, the better she felt.

Further: As Gen pushed further towards her goal of becoming an acrobat, her daydreams about starring in the circus became more vivid.




Anyway vs. Anyways

Rule:

"Anyways" is informal and incorrect. Use "anyway" instead.

Example:

Anyway: Tony wasn't going to eat all those lobsters anyway.





Among vs. Between

Rule:

"Among" is for 2+ persons/things (preposition).

"Between" is for only 2 persons/things (preposition).

Examples:

Among: There were rumblings among the three reporters when Amber declared herself the best chess player in the world.

Between: Angelina had to choose between chocolate and vanilla ice cream.

Bruno Mars can jump further than most people, which helped him win the track meet.

Bruno Mars can jump <u>farther</u> than most people, which helped him win the track meet.
