The Educational Technology Team wanted to send you some information to be thinking about prior to the March 13th Technology Integration and Innovation UnConference. We received feedback after the prior two district technology professional development days that teachers wanted time and space to be able to collaborate and dig into the tools and strategies being used by their colleagues across the district. We would like to honor that request by having you participate in an UnConference. For those of you that are unfamiliar with this format, we wanted to give you a little preview of how it is structured, although you will also get more information the day of the unConference.

Prior to March 13th you will receive an email with the agenda, that will include links and information needed for the morning.

Using an "unConference" format, teachers will gather at the school assigned to their grade level. K-2 & Elementary PE Teachers (Holt), Grades 3-5 & Elementary Music & SPED Teachers (Gilham), Grades 6-8 Teachers (Roosevelt)

PROCESS:

- 1. All teachers will start as a large group in the cafeteria of the school they have been assigned to (see above).
- 2. A more in depth explanation of the UnConference format and pertinent information for the morning with be shared.
- 3. Staff will then break into grade level and/or subject area groupings.
- 4. In these whole-group sessions participants will be led through a brainstorming process by grade level facilitators, to create a list of topics and breakout sessions based on the group's interests. Topics will then be assigned to sessions in classrooms. Sessions are discussion-based, where participants actively contribute their experience to develop collective expertise. Participants can move between sessions if they find interest in multiple sessions. This is time to explore and share collaboratively and the opportunity to create a hands on professional learning experience differentiated to your needs.
- 5. Please be thinking about questions or topics of interest, that you would like time to explore more in depth. This will help guide the agenda for the day. Please see examples below:
