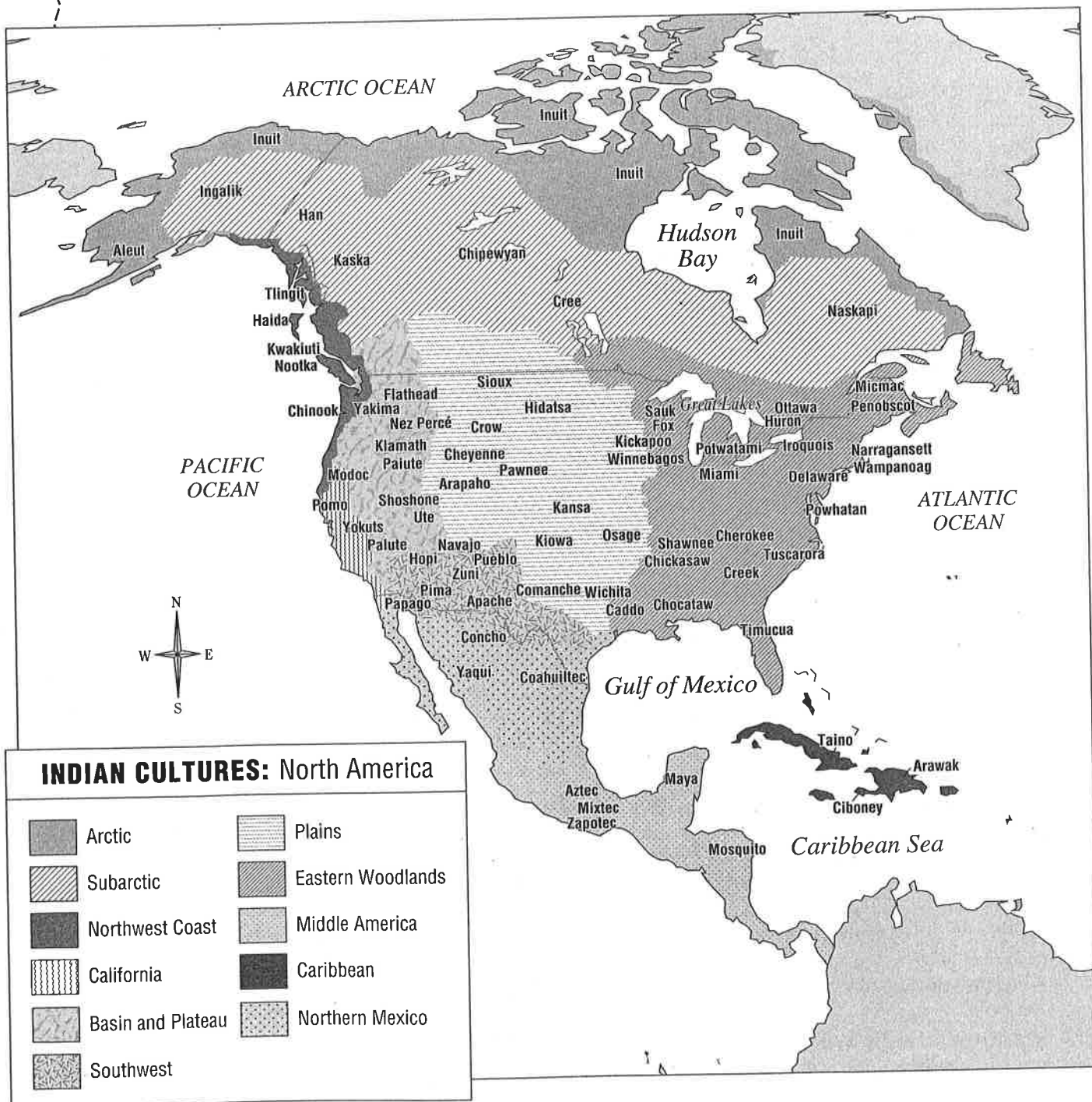


Indian Culture Areas
