# The Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art invites submissions for the 9th annual *NewArt Northwest Kids* exhibition.

Teachers of public, private, and home school students in grades K–12 may submit work for consideration in this show of student art.

## About the exhibition

This year's theme, "The Road Not Taken," explores students' visual depictions and definitions of their lives, travel, or hopes for the future. Students are encouraged to read Robert Frost's poem *The Road Not Taken* and consider the ideas conveyed to them through the poet's words. The art created should address the broad theme of choices made in life, travel, or exploration, including real or imaginary outcomes that can be expressed in visual form through paintings, photographs, prints, digital art, illustration, and collage. Creative writing, in answer to the questions posed in the entry form, should also be included. Please note that 3D work cannot be considered at this time. The theme can be connected to common core subject areas of history, social studies, science, and language arts. See <http://jsma.uoregon.edu/nank> for more activity ideas responding to the theme.

## How to participate

Teachers are asked to select a limited number of student works to submit—one entry per student, please. Museum staff will select a maximum of fifty pieces for the show.

## Submissions must adhere to the following guidelines:

- Artwork must have been created within the past year.
- Two-dimensional work only, unmatted and unframed.
- Maximum size: 12 inches x 16 inches.
- Submissions must include a completed entry form and be received by January 22, 2016.
- Submitted works must be picked up from the museum in person by June 6, 2016. Student artwork will not be returned by mail. Unclaimed artwork will become property of the museum.
- Students whose work is selected will receive a free museum-quality frame for their matted work and a sketchbook.
- All entrants will receive a free family guest pass to the Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art, and there may be an opportunity for works to be digitally displayed.
