## Western Russia

Did you know? Historically, the city of St. Petersburg was very important. In fact, at one point it was the capital city of Russia. From St. Petersburg, the Russians could sail through the Baltic Sea and out into the Atlantic Ocean. From there they could trade along the coast of

Western Africa. Because of its location, St. Petersburg was prone to flooding. Modern St. Petersburg has a system of dikes and canals to control the flood waters. Today, St. Petersburg is a popular place for tourists to visit because of the beautiful buildings and canals.

- 8. Which city on the banks of the Volga River is also near the Caspian Sea?
- 9. Name the river that passes by Pechora.
- 10. What city lays along the Volga River at about 56°30'N and 35°30'E?
