Opacity- The condition of lacking transparency

C.R.A.P- Contrast, Repition, Alignment, Proximity

Watermark- A faint design made in some paper during manufacture

C.Y.M.K- Color model used... Cyan, Yellow, Magenta, Black

Logotype- A single piece of type that prints a word or group of separate letters

Type- A specific style of type within a type family

Borderline- A line marking a border

Typeface- A set of characters with similar appearance and design

Logo and Logotype

The intent of my logo was to go for a ramp with my company name and a scooter on coping. I wanted to integrate the company name with the ramp so I decided to put it right in the middle. I added the scooter for effect and I put on coping for the scooter to sit on something. It was difficult to make the right angles for the ramp but once I found the arc line tool it got easy.




Use of Space


When the logo is used on any object there should be at least 1/8th of an inch space around the logo. It applies to all sides. The "Feeble Scootering" should always be capitalized and in the same typeface.



Color

My colors were chosen very specifically because I needed a lighter brown for the top of the ramp and a darker brown to show shadows on the side of the ramp. I decided to go for black on the letters because it is easily seen against the light brown. The colors really complimented each other to make the logo look nice.





Typography




Business Card


Envelope

Letterhead
