Summer Enrichment Program

The Summer Enrichment Program (SEP) is a residential academic experience for gifted students in grades 6-11. SEP is located at the University of Oregon. Students will experience college life by living in the dorms and take classes for two weeks. The classes are designed to be challenging. The classes are taught by advanced certified teachers, graduate students, and professors.



SEP Classes

SEP students ages 12-18 enroll in their choice of six academic and arts-related classes from a list of approximately 55 options. Classes are held from 9AM to 4PM each day. Instruction is at a level comparable to classes offered at an early college or high school advanced placement level. In the late afternoons, students have flexible time to explore the University of Oregon campus and socialize with TAG peers and program staff. In the evenings and on weekends, students attend a variety of well-planned social activities.

Junior Counselor Leadership

The Junior Counselor program provides a strong leadership training opportunity for TAG students currently in grades 11-12. These participants often have attended the regular SEP camp previously and are ready for new challenges. Each JC is paired and works closely with a counselor. Together as a team, they ensure campers' safety and well-being. Mentorships have long been correlated with the success of advanced learners, underscoring the tremendous opportunity available to students who participate in this experience. The junior counselors attend classes that are tailored for college readiness, personal reflection, and community awareness.
