We end our year with contributions made during the Renaissance, influence of the Roman Catholic Church in Europe, Protestantism, and examine the Age of Exploration. We know it's a lot to cover in one year, but we will accomplish it.

Language Arts will have a strong focus on reading, writing, and research. We will try to integrate this with the concepts being taught in Social Studies. We will also be using the Book Love program to help students continue to develop an excitement for independent reading.
